
Origins

The Alliance was formed in 1972 as a coalition of Non-Government Organizations (NGOs) having consultative status with the United Nations and dedicated to crime prevention and criminal justice improvements. The Alliance subsequently broadened its membership to include selected NGOs not in consultative status with UN bodies, but actively interested in international crime and justice.


Organized at the instigation of William Clifford, the first Chief of the then Social Defense Section, now the UN Office on Drugs and Crime, of the UN's Social and Economic Council, the Alliance was chaired during its formative years by Professor Gerhard O.W. Mueller of the New York University School of Law, and later the Chief of the UN Office on Drugs and Crime.
